TDA Consulting Awarded \$2.3 Million in HUD Technical Assistance and Capacity Building Funds

Laurinburg, NC, December 21, 2017 – TDA Consulting, Inc. (TDA) announced today that it has been awarded \$2,308,608 in technical assistance and capacity building funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). These funds will be used by TDA to help HUD's customers navigate complex housing and community development challenges by equipping them with the knowledge, skills, tools, capacity, and systems to implement HUD programs and policies successfully.

TDA will provide technical assistance and capacity building that focuses on four areas:

- **Community Compass** – \$875,000 awarded under this cross-departmental funding approach to support technical assistance across HUD's programs and customers, including, but not limited to, public housing agencies, cities, tribes and tribally-designated housing entities, multifamily owners and operators, non-profit organizations receiving HUD funding, and housing counseling agencies.
- **McKinney-Vento** – \$775,000 awarded to provide technical assistance to increase the effectiveness of implementing and administering Continuum of Care planning processes, improving capacity to prepare collaborative applications, preventing the separation of families in projects funded under the Emergency Solutions Grants and Continuum of Care grants programs, and adopting and providing best practices in housing and services for persons experiencing homelessness.
- **National Homeless Data Analysis Project** – \$350,000 awarded to provide support to Continuums of Care to achieve the highest level of performance and results for Homeless Management Information System implementation, as well as for management, operation of software, data collection for annual reporting, including data

utilization, performance measurement, reporting, and research to prevent and end homelessness.

- HOME Investment Partnerships Program – \$308,608 awarded to provide technical assistance related to affordable housing, mixed finance development, and homeownership, including reporting requirements in the Integrated Disbursement and Information System and financial management of HOME grants.

In addition, TDA is the lead technical assistance provider for HUD's technical assistance programs, supporting HUD in the coordination of activities among all technical assistance and capacity building providers.

"We look forward to continuing our efforts to help HUD's customers develop the skills, tools, and knowledge that ensure effective program delivery and efficient stewardship of federal funds," said Dionne Roberts, President and Chief Executive Officer of TDA. "We are grateful for HUD's continued confidence in our ability to help achieve positive outcomes for its programs."
